PAPERLESS? NOPE ... NOT YET

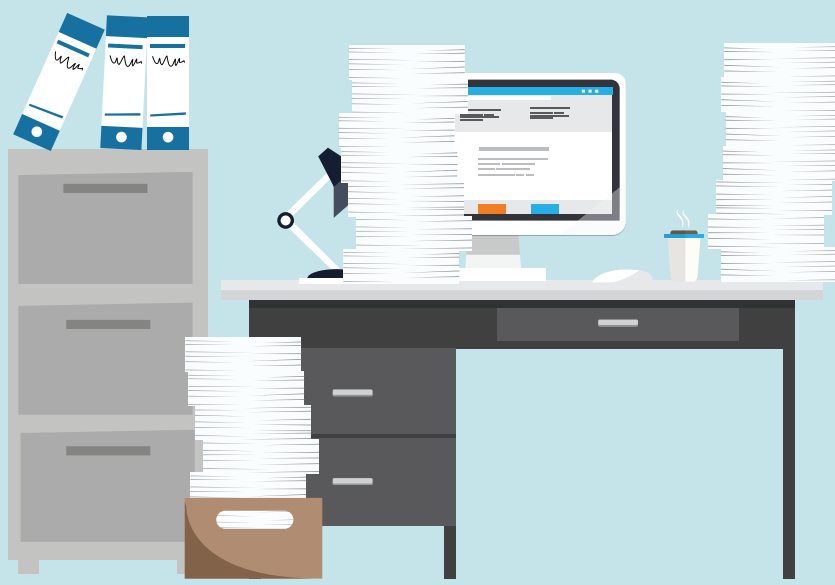
8 out of 10 workers print at least one document a day



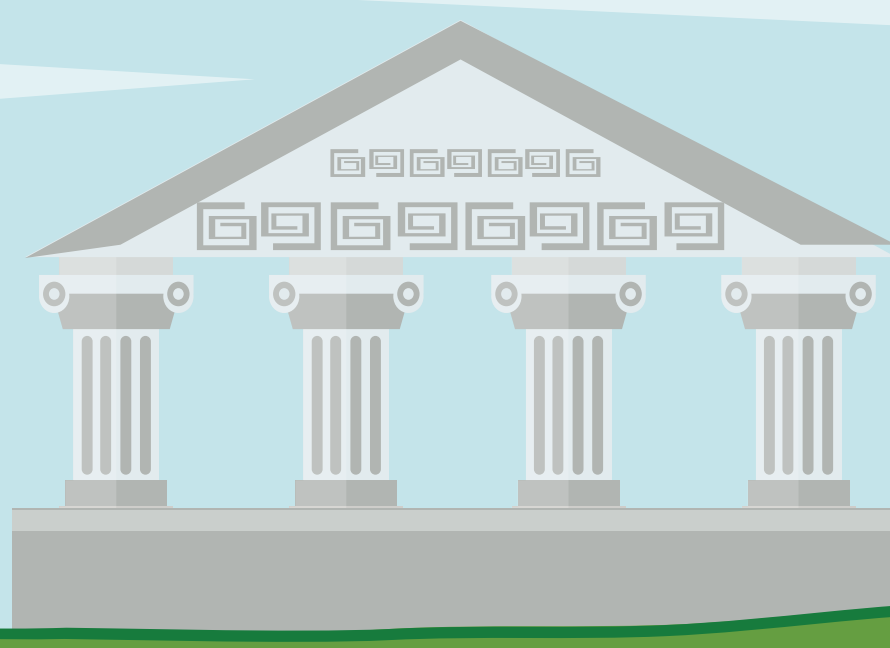
PRINTING FILES CREATES RISKS

At least **58%** of all paper documents received are left in paper form on desks or in file cabinets.

While **38%** report that paper documents are lost or misplaced at least a few times each month, this number is likely even higher because 62% answered "I don't know."



3 out of 10 of people said they've read something that confidential and not intended for them because it was printed and left unsecured in their office.



SIGNATURES ARE ALL WET

While some companies are digitizing their paper files, documents that require signatures often remain paper-based.

55% of organizations still use paper-based processes for processes docs that require signatures.
